4. **LifeTouch Photos** - Phil Anderson

We discussed the staff's and family's experience with LifeTouch.

- There were questions about the timing of proofs coming out. They seemed to trickle in at various times instead of collectively. *Phil mentioned that this was due to the way families ordered and the strike with Canada Post. Families that ordered their pictures online saw their proofs within 3 days and received them quicker. Families that waited until they received a physical proof took longer to get the proof, order and then receive their packages.*
- Some families received emails with digital codes and some did not. *Phil said that digital codes were provided to families that signed into LifeTouch online and gave their emails. When they opt in with an email they can get Loyalty LifeTouch Rewards. With the rewards it works out to about \$10 for every \$65 you spend to be used towards something else.*
- They looked really good

- The manner in which photos were taken was very efficient (2 photographers)
- The photographers were very flexible and accommodating

Phil requested that we sign a contract for 2 years. This would benefit us by enabling us to get 3 free picture packages for families.
