7. Student Success Plan

Coaching Block ended December 20th. Our coaches supported classroom instruction in a variety of ways. They helped find and reallocate resources. Some classrooms received much needed supplies for their classroom libraries. A communal area for literacy resources (leveled texts, guided reading/ small group texts and teacher resources) has been identified and organized. The math and literacy coach offered professional development on November 23rd and December 4rth. Our coaches supported classroom instruction in; guided reading, small group instruction, 3 - part lessons, reading assessment, writers and readers workshop model and fact fluency assessment and instruction.

Our second data pull for reading was December 2nd and overall there was improvement in students meeting reading benchmarks. Previously 56% of students in the English program were meeting reading benchmarks. Currently 65% are meeting. Previously 42% of students in the French program were meeting reading benchmarks. Currently 52% are meeting.

8. <u>Inclusive Education Policy</u> (PD for Principal's and SAC chairs)

November 30th Lynn and I went to a PD for principles and SAC chairs that focused on the Inclusive Education Policy. Inclusive education is a commitment to ensuring a high-quality, culturally and linguistically responsive and equitable education to support the well-being and achievement of every student. All students should feel that they belong in an inclusive school—accepted, safe, and valued—so they can best learn and succeed. This is an umbrella document that is integrated into all supporting policies.

9. Donations

The Volunteer Committee known as the **Music 4 Mental Health** (a new non-profit society) has donated **\$2000** to Seaside Elementary School to support a mental health related school project or projects in the 2023-2024 school year.
